

Exemption from provisions of Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017

In accordance with section 220 of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 (the Act), I, Darren Handforth, Head of High Hazards, Energy and Public Safety at WorkSafe New Zealand, exempt Turnbull & Bond Ltd from compliance with regulations 11.22(1)(c) of the Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017 (the HS Regulations) for the filling station located in the forecourt at 74 Wansbeck Street, Oamaru ('the site').

I do so having had regard to the prescribed requirements in regulation 11.40 of the HS Regulations; and being satisfied that the extent of the exemption is not broader than is reasonably necessary to address the matters that gave rise to the proposed exemption, and that the exemption is not inconsistent with the purpose of the Act; and subject to the following conditions—

Turnbull & Bond Ltd must -

- (1) maintain a minimum separation distance of 5.3 metres (the current separation distance) between the forecourt cylinder filling station and the retail building; and
- (2) ensure the forecourt cylinder filling station remains electronic; and
- (3) ensure that LPG cylinders are not stored adjacent to the forecourt cylinder filling station; and
- (4) not use the forecourt cylinder filling station to fill cylinders with a capacity of more than 9 kilograms; and
- (5) ensure that there are no more than two cylinders at the forecourt cylinder filling station; and
- (6) ensure LPG cylinders of 4 kilograms and greater are filled with the ullage tube closed; and
- (7) provide a copy of this exemption to any compliance certifier engaged to issue a location compliance certificate; and
- (8) hold a copy of this exemption at the site.

This exemption takes effect on 3 March 2021 and expires on 3 March 2026 unless it is replaced sooner or revoked.
