

Exemption from provisions of Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017

In accordance with section 220 of the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015 (the Act), I, Darren Handforth, Head of High Hazards, Energy and Public Safety at WorkSafe New Zealand, exempt Gas, Fire and Cylinder Services 2020 Ltd, trading as Gas, Fire and Cylinder Services from compliance with regulations 15.13, 15.16 and 15.17 of the Health and Safety at Work (Hazardous Substances) Regulations 2017 from the requirements to have a design-verification compliance certificate, cylinder pre-commissioning compliance certificate and a cylinder import compliance certificate in respect to the two Faber 7L steel dive cylinders with the serial numbers 19/1748/053 and 19/1748/037.

I do so having had regard to the prescribed requirements in regulation 15.18 of the HS Regulations; and being satisfied that

• The cylinder is similar to an approved design that ensures a high level of safety when the cylinder is pressurised.

An exemption is granted subject to the following conditions—

- 1. This exemption is limited to the two Faber cylinders with serial numbers 19/1748/053 and 19/1748/037.
- 2. The gas traffic for the two Faber cylinders with serial numbers 19/1748/053 and 19/1748/037 is limited to Breathing Air, Nitrox and Trimix only.
- 3. Gas, Fire and Cylinder Services must, in accordance with regulation 15.60 of the HS Regulations, stamp the cylinders as follows:
 - a. Stamp the two cylinders 19/1748/053 and 19/1748/037 with the approval number LAB7729SP.
 - b. Stamp the station mark of the approved test station that marked the two cylinders with approval number LAB7729SP; and
 - c. stamp the date the approval number LAB7729SP was marked on the cylinder.
- 4. Gas, Fire and Cylinder Services must not stamp the approval number LAB7729SP on any other cylinder.



This exemption takes effect on **18 June 2021** and expires on **18 June 2026** unless it is sooner replaced or revoked.
